I hope you all had a wonderful summer.

Little Polgooth Road Closure.

Over the summer, I have been involved in addressing the ongoing road closure that has impacted many of our local residents this has been ongoing since January this year after Storm Goretti.

After meeting with numerous local residents, I organised a meeting with the lead design engineer for the new replacement road. While this has taken nine months to reach this stage, the project is now scheduled to begin imminently.

The work is expected to take four weeks, putting us on track for completion well before the end of the year.

During the meeting residents had the opportunity to ask questions directly, learning how the road will be secured, the precise timeline, and the expected completion date. The Gathering was very positive and constructive. I am actively monitoring their progress to ensure they deliver on their commitments so our community can finally move forward.

Hewas Water

Over the last couple of weeks, I've been working closely with residents in Hewas Water regarding a notice they received about cutting back trees and hedges along the lane. They were very upset and confused by this notice, in all the years they have lived at their address they have never had to maintain this section of the lane. After



several emails back and forth with Highways, a Steward is now scheduled to inspect the site directly. I'm staying in regular touch with the residents and will follow up with them as soon as the site visit is complete.

Pavement.

After noticing unrepaired pavement at PL26 7BE in Polgooth, I asked Highways for an explanation regarding the delay. They reported that overall budget limitations prevent a complete resurfacing, but they are assessing whether a targeted repair scheme can address this specific spot before the end of the financial year.

It was raised the vegetation along St Mewan Lane is very overgrown, making pavement very narrow.

Highways are stating they are only doing reactive issues, as the finances are poor. It would be interesting to know what maintenance they are planning to do on different road classes so the Parish Council can prepare.

Currently obtaining quotes for legals, Wellers have come back at £1950, a Teams Meeting is organised with Birketts for Friday so they can quote. The License needs to ensure St Austell Shed are responsible for the car park, and the Sheddors lock the gate etc.
