OC182/19 Declarations of Interest from Members / Dispensations

The Chairman moved Agenda Item 4 Clean Earth Energy to Agenda Item 3.

OC183/19 Clean Earth Energy

Dean Robson – Currently there are two turbines in the parish but there has been little scope to erect further wind turbines due to the airport and the difference in turbine heights. There is now an opportunity for limited developments with the intention of keeping turbines below the height of other obstacles and wish to propose certain locations which may be suitable in the parish.

Amber Trenberth circulated charts identifying four potentially acceptable sites, on Imerys land, and would be in similar locations to the existing two, causing least visual impact and showing comparisons to the existing turbines in the parish. With Cornwall Council and St Mewan Parish Council declaring a climate emergency there is a desire to development, however appreciating there can be contentious issues particularly with visual impact. The height of new turbines proposed are 135m tall and will generate eight times more power compared to the existing turbines at 77m. This will save 100,000 tonnes of carbon in 30 years.

Clean Earth Energy will email the PDF charts and is happy to attend a further meeting to discuss feedback if the council are mindful to support the proposals.

The Chairman invited questions and Clean Earth Energy confirmed: -

- Four potential locations in the Parish
- To replace at the end of their life span
- Garlennick turbines are 110m in height
- Discounted other sites in the parish which are close to properties
- Financial scheme will be available and honoured
- Altitude does have a bearing on wind speeds

Cornwall Cllr Bob Egerton confirmed Cornwall Council are working on a Climate Change Action Plan currently looking at allocated land in the Site Allocation Development Plan Document.

OC189/19 Climate Change Objectives

Cllr Holman confirms there is no firm policy that the parish council can follow at present, therefore it will be difficult to link in with the St Mewan Neighbourhood Plan.

Parish Cllrs Harrison and Holman, portfolio holders for climate change will attend the Climate Change Workshop on the 30th January 2020 and report back to full council.

Cllr Wallis expresses there is no Neighbourhood Development Plan policy on renewable energy which is part of climate change objectives.

Cllr Kneller re-enforces the parish council needs clarity of the process the adopted plan may have to take if any changes or additions are proposed.

Cornwall Cllr Bob Egerton welcomes the engagement with parish councils demonstrating proposals they may wish to move forward and is available for future discussions.

He also appreciates the parish council is currently without a ward councillor and offers his assistance with any matters the council may need raising.

The Chairman thanked Cornwall Cllr Bob Egerton for attending the meeting and his offer of assistance.

OC190/19 Wildflower Planting

The draft wildflower planting specification prepared by Cllr Wallis was discussed. The clerk advised council she had spoken with Rachel Tatlow from Highways on an area of Cornwall Council land included in the brief and Highways agreed in principal providing the parish council submits a map, the type of seeds to be used and how we intend cordoning off. It was suggested the council may wish to consider traffic cones and tape with accompanying A4 poster advising the public of why it is cordoned off. If posts are considered Highways will need more details as there could be underground services to be considered on excavation and erection of posts. It was

RESOLVED to approve the draft specification for Cllr Wallis and the Clerk to obtain three quotations and the clerk to liaise with Highways. Prop Cllr Kneller, sec Cllr Mrs Tarbox. **Action: Cllr Wallis and Clerk.**

OC191/19 St Mewan Parish Council Action Plan

Cllr Mrs Tarbox - to consider a village feature in Trewoon by relocating the parish council notice board, purchase two benches and flower tubs.

Cllr Mrs Padley – to consider the planting of more trees and create more allotment space in the Parish. The clerk confirms there is a waiting list for Trewoon.

Cllr Kneller suggests consulting to see if there is demand for more allotments in the parish.

The clerk asks council if they would consider a contribution for expenses to each village group who goes ahead.

OC193/19 Litter Bin in Trewoon

A resident's request for the provision of a litter bin to be provided for Trewoon at the northern end of the village. The village has seen expanded growth in the form of additional housing estates at this end of the village namely Pyramid Close and Badger's Watch, where there is no provision for litter. Close monitoring by the resident has revealed pedestrians/residents from the northern estates returning home from the local shop, discarding their beer cans/glass bottles, scratch cards, food cartons, crisp bags, chocolate wrappers (as well as dog dirt bags) on the pavement and in the hedgerow. - Cllr Holman Localism meeting. The presentation re-enforced the government meaning of Localism and how they are pushing power away from the centre to every council, neighbourhood and home in the country. Local government is properly accountable to local people, not Westminster. If you want people to feel like they have a stake in the future of their communities, that they are really connected to what's going on, you give people closer to home a real say over what happens there and the power to make a difference.
